POPPY DAY MAY 4th has been designated **POPPY DAY** in Shell

Rock. The poppy's are made at the Veterans Home in Marshalltown. Money received from the distribution goes to support Veterans or the V.A. Home in Marshalltown, local veterans of Butler County and Homeless Veterans in Iowa among other Veteran needs. The poppy is a symbol of the sacrifice of Veterans and has been a program sponsored by the American Legion Auxiliary since 1920 when it was adopted as the signature Memorial Poppy. The

The American Legion Family's connection to the poppy

1920

The poppy becomes the official memorial flower of the Legion Family.

George F. Plant Post 1 in Milwaukee distributes 50,000 poppies and collect \$5,500 in donations for charitable purposes.

1942

More than 100,000 American Legion Auxiliary volunteers distributes 13 million poppies made by veterans.

1964

President Lyndon B. Johnson accepts the 20 millionth poppy to launch the Auxiliary's annual drive.

1988

Nearly 25 million Americans wear a poppy to honor America's war dead and veterans, contributing nearly \$2 million for rehabilitation and welfare programs in local communities.

2017

Congress passes legislation in support of National Poppy Day.
